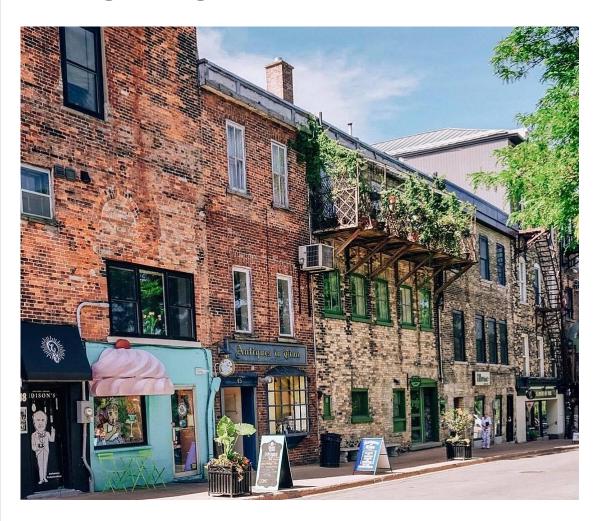


Destination Stratford launches three additional audio tours as a result of growing interest and demand

Public Art Walk - Calling all art lovers! Art and culture are the lifeblood of Stratford. Public art installations have sprung up throughout the city as early as 1897. Starting at <u>Gallery Stratford</u>, the artistic heart of the city, we invite you to explore twenty one points of interest as a sneak-peek into our cultural soul. Audio tour narrated by

the talented Stratford native <u>Dayna Manning</u> featuring music from her latest album, <u>Morning Light</u>.

Insta-Worthy Spots - Have you ever wondered where Stratford's most Insta-Worthy spots are located? Have no fear, we're here to tell you! Featuring 15 stops, your feed will be full of likes in no time! Stratford is so full of beautiful and interesting backdrops, perfect for your Instagram feed.
